1번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 남자가 어머니의 생일선물로 준비할 것을 고르세요.

W: You look so serious, Peter. What's up?

M: Well, Laura, tomorrow is my mom's birthday. I am thinking about what to
buy for her.

W: How about a scarf?

M: I already gave her one last year.

W: Then how about a bag?

M: My dad is probably going to give her a bag. And my sister is planning to buy
either a polka dot skirt or a blouse. I want to give my mom something special this
year.

W: Hmm, how about baking a birthday cake for her?

M: Oh, that's a good idea. But I don't know how and I don't have enough time.

W: I'll help you. Let's get started.

M: Thanks. You are such a great friend.

2번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 대화하고 있는 장소를 고르세요.

W: Could you take off your shoes, sir?

M: Why?

W: We need to run your shoes through the X-ray scanner.

M: They're sneakers. How can I hide anything in them?

W: We have to check them. It's airport policy.

M: Okay, okay. I will do what you say.

W: Sir, please step aside. Do you have any metal in your pockets?

M: Oh, my keys.

W: You have to take everything out of your pockets.
