ANN: 그러면 지금부터 3교시 외국어 영역 듣기 및 말하기 평가를 시작하겠습니다. 1번부터 13번 문제까지는 듣고 답하는 문제이며, 14번부터 17번까지는 말하고자 하는 내용을 답지에서 골라 답하는 문제입니다. 방송을 잘 듣고 답을 하시기 바랍니다. 듣는 내용은 한번만 방송됩니다.

1. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 선택하게 될 휴대전화 배경화면을 고르시오. [1점]

M: What are you doing with your cell phone?

W: I bought the latest model yesterday. So I'm checking out the clock settings one by one.

M: Hmm, this is an analog type.

W: Yeah, but the minute hand is not easy to read. Uh-huh, the next one is also an analog type with a calendar. I'll pass.

M: Look, this shows the time in a digital mode along with a calendar. You can check them together.

W: But I'd like a simpler one without a calendar. Let's look at the next one.

M: This type has bigger letters. Do you like it?

W: No, I prefer small letters. How about this one? The time and the date are on the upper right side of the screen.

M: Cool! And it doesn't block the background.

W: Okay, I'll choose this one.

2. 대화를 듣고, 남자의 심정으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M : What's in that bag?

W : This is a new dress. *[pause]* Look! Isn't it fashionable?

M : Again? That's the third dress you've bought this month.

W : Dad, a girl needs to look her best at all times.

M : You're right, but you've been spending like there's no tomorrow.

W : Do you want me to go around in worn-out clothes?

M : I don't mean that. I just want you to learn how to budget.

W : I have a part time job and earn enough money to buy my clothes.

M : Don't you know why people go broke? It's because of wrong spending habits.

Good money management is important.

W : Okay. I got your point.

3. 다음을 듣고, 무엇에 관한 설명인지 고르시오. [3점]

M: This is an extremely powerful aid to memory. It makes you think, and thinking leaves a trace in your memory. When you can do this after learning something, it means that you know more than 80 percent of the material. But if you only read the material but cannot do this, you might get about 20 percent when tested two weeks later. This technique is to say some ideas in your memory out loud. You should also repeat aloud some passages, poems, or other texts that you have learned as much as possible.

4. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

[Phone rings.]

W: Hello, Student Center. How may I help you?

M: Hi. This is Jason Lee, a senior majoring in Physical Education. I'm calling for a part-time job.

W: Okay. When are you available?

M: Either on the weekends or in the evenings.

W: Let's see. *[typing sound]* Are you interested in packing boxes at the supermarket from 6 to 9? How about that?

M: Not bad, but I'd really prefer something outdoors.

W: Alright, let's see. *[pause]* There's a weekend job at the pool in the community center. But you need a lifeguard certificate.

M: I got one last semester.

W: Good. Can you come by with the photocopy of it? I need to send it to the center.

M: Sure. I'll be there this afternoon.

5. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 남자에게 지불할 총 금액을 고르시오.

W: Excuse me. Are these things for sale?

M: Sure. This is the best garage sale event in Madison.

W: Great. Well, I like this small coffee table.

M: It's an antique table. I'm selling it for \$40.

W: \$40? Not bad. *[pause]* How much are you selling this lamp for? It looks unique.

M: The price is \$65. It is from India.

W: That's quite expensive. I saw a similar one selling for \$50 at a bazaar last week.

M: This is totally different from others. It is a handmade lamp.

W: Well, how about \$90 for both the table and the lamp?

M: Sorry, but I can't sell at that price. But, I can give you \$5 off if you buy both.

W: Okay. I'll take them.

6. 다음을 듣고, 여자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Ladies and gentlemen! Nowadays we are facing many social problems. We cannot emphasize too much the importance of education in solving them. I mean, education changes everything. And here's one thing all of you can do for our children's education. As you know, next Tuesday is Election Day and it's your chance to make a decision. W : Really? I didn't know that. I'll replace it right now.

M : You should. Also, fire extinguishers have to be well maintained. Both you and your employees must know how to use them.

W : Of course, all of us can operate them.

M : Very good. I need you to sign here.

W: Wow! No wonder you look so strong and fit.

M: Thank you. I feel like a new man! But sometimes I want to get some fresh air.

W: That's why I am exercising here. Plus, I like seeing trees as well as getting clean air while jogging.

M: That's true. This place is also famous for its scenic walks and peaceful lake.

W: Why don't you come here at least on weekends?

M: Yeah. That's what I'm thinking.
