**ANN:** 그러면 지금부터 3교시 외국어 영역 듣기 및 말하기 평가를 시작하겠습니다. 1번부터 13번 문제까지는 듣고 답하는 문제이며, 14번부터 17번까지는 말하고자 하는 내용을 답지에서 골라 답하는 문제입니다. 방송을 잘 듣고 답을 하시기 바랍니다. 듣는 내용은 한번만 방송됩니다.

1. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 구입할 연필꽂이를 고르시오.

M: Good afternoon. May I help you?

W: Yes, please. I'm looking for a pencil holder to put on my desk.

M: Okay. We have a wide selection of pencil holders. Do you want a round-shaped one or a square-shaped one?

W: I prefer a square-shaped one.

M: Then, how about this one? It is small so it doesn't take up much space on your desk.

W: Hmm, it looks cute. But I want a holder with some separate blocks.

M: No problem. Then, this one will be right for you. It has one big section in the middle with two small sections on both sides.

W: I like it, but is there any other model with different pictures on it? I don't like the cartoon animals on it.

M: We have the same model with flowers on it.

W: It's great. I'll take it.

2. 대화를 듣고, 남자의 심정으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Brandon, you seem to have something on your mind. What's up?

M: I just got a call from the head office. I'm being transferred.

W: What department are you getting transferred to?

M: They're sending me to the sales department, but I wanted to go to public relations.

W: Oh, that's why you don't look happy.

M: Yeah, recently I've been working hard to increase my qualifications by taking courses related to public relations.

W: Did you talk about it with the company?

M: I did. But they said there's nothing they can do at the moment.

W: I see. Well, I'm sure you'll get a better opportunity some day.

M: Thanks. This just isn't my time I guess.

3. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 주제로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Hello, everyone. Recently, we've been discussing how to work out safely, focusing on the importance of "warming up". But, "cooling down" after exercise is just as important as "warming up" before exercise, in order to reduce the risk of injury. "Cooling down" means gradually slowing down the level of activity. It helps the heart rate and breathing return to normal, and can prevent dizziness or pain. It also helps the body flush out toxins and release tension. When exercise is suddenly stopped, blood and waste products stay in the muscles, which can cause swelling and pain. "Cooling down" helps the blood return to the heart in adequate quantities so as to reduce the amount of waste products in the muscles.

4. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Julie, it's 4:30. Did you find all the books you need for your science paper?  
W: Yes, luckily I found two, so I don't need to go to a bookstore.  
M: Good, let's go to the checkout. I found everything I need in this science magazine.  
W: Wait a minute, Mike. You can't check out periodicals such as magazines.  
M: Really? I didn't know that. But I need these 10 pages of articles.  
W: It's okay. They allow you to make photocopies.  
M: Great. Can I pay for copying with cash?  
W: No, you can't. In this library, you have to use a "copy card". You can use mine if you need to.  
M: Okay. Thanks.  
W: It's almost closing time. While I borrow the books, you'd better get your pages copied. You have to go downstairs.  
M: Okay.

This is such a famous book that we don't need a long introduction, but just in case any of our listeners are unfamiliar with it, I'll briefly introduce it. Since its publication in 1970, it has been popular with people who feel anxiety about a life-changing decision. Everyone struggles and feels stress in times of change. I chose this as an 'end-of-the year book' because with the coming of a new year come new changes, and this book gives the message that change is a positive thing in life and should be seen as an opportunity. So, it's a good idea for you to read this book and think about the changes in your life.

M: What are you doing there, Kate?

W: Oh, Jack. This vacuum cleaner doesn't work very well. Could you help me?

M: Okay. Let me see.... *[pause]* I think there's a problem with the motor.

W: Oh no! Then, what should I do?

M: Why don't you call hotel maintenance and ask them to repair it?

W: But I have to clean several guest rooms in an hour. I don't have enough time.

M: I see. *[pause]* Oh, wait a minute. I saw an extra vacuum cleaner in the utility room this morning.

W: Really? Could you get it for me? I need to arrange the bed sheets and towels before check-in time.

M: Sure. I'll do it right away.

W: Thanks a million.

W: Exactly. So I called the insurance company and they sent a tow truck.

M: That's too bad. Is the car on the lift yours?

W: Yes, it's being fixed now.

M: So what did the mechanic say?

W: He said a bad oil pump is the problem.

M: That's why a regular inspection is important.

W: You're right. I think I should have my car checked regularly.
