ANN : 여러분 안녕하십니까? 지금부터 전국 15개 시·도교육청이 공동으로 주관하는 2010학년도 제 1회 고등학교 2학년 영어 듣기능력 평가를 시작하겠습니다. 교실에 계시는 선생님들께서는 라디오의 음량을 알맞게 조절해 주시고, 학생 여러분은 답안지에 반, 번호 그리고 이름을 써넣으시기 바랍니다. 모든 문제는 한 번씩만 들려드리니, 잘 듣고 지시에 따라 물음에 답하시기 바랍니다.

ANN : 이제 시작하겠습니다.

1번입니다. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 설명하는 것과 일치하는 그림을 고르세요.

M:

Do you want to keep in shape? You can make your body stronger by doing this simple exercise. With your chin up, reach up to grip the bar with your hands about shoulder-width apart. Your hands should be palms-down on top of the bar. Take a deep breath and let it out slowly as you use your arms and shoulders to pull yourself up. Keep going until your chin is at the same level as the bar. Then lower yourself slowly, and try it again.

2번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 지불해야 할 금액을 고르세요.

M: What are you looking at?

W: My cell phone bill for this month.

M: Oh, it should be much lower than usual. You signed up for the new discount phone rate. How much is the bill?

W: Actually, it's \$5 more than last month's bill.

M: More than last month's? You paid \$35 last month. How can that be? Let me see it.

W: The salesperson told me I'd save a lot.

M: Hey, don't get upset so quickly. A section down here shows an eight-dollar discount and the new total amount is at the very bottom. What you saw was not the total sum.

W: Oh, really? I didn't notice it.

3번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 선택한 이동 방법을 고르세요.

W: Now we should decide how to get there. I think we should fly. It's the fastest option.

M: Fastest, but most expensive. We need to be careful about spending money. Besides, if we fly, we'll miss out on the landscape. It's one of the best parts of travelling.

W: All right, airplanes are out, then. How about hitchhiking? It costs nothing.

M: No, no, no. I've got this pretty bad prejudice about hitchhiking from movies. Accidents always happen as soon as somebody gets a free ride. It would be better to go on foot than to take any risks.

W: Sure, sure. I don't want to argue with you and ruin our trip before we even hit the road. The only other options left are a bus or a train.

M: I'd like to sit back on a train and enjoy the scenery.

W: As you wish. They're not as convenient as buses, though.

4번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람의 관계로 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

M: So, what seems to be the problem?

W: Ellis doesn't seem herself lately. She doesn't eat as much as she used to and looks tired all the time. She doesn't even bark at strangers.

M: I see. How long has she been like this?

W: For three days, I guess. She began to lose her appetite three days ago, and she rarely wags her tail.

M: All right. Let's see....Her eyes tell me she still has some strength. It probably won't be a big problem. Have you given her anything unusual?

W: No, not at all. She's been fed what she's always had.

M: Hmm....I think I need to check her out to see what's going on with her.

5번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 가장 걱정하고 있는 것을 고르세요.

M: Wow! They are so lovely. Congratulations, Megan.

W: Thanks. I'm glad they're healthy.

M: Do these little ones have names?

W: Josh and Peter.

M: Hello, Josh and Peter! This is your uncle, Jack. It's so great to see you guys. You are so adorable.

W: Yeah, they are beautiful, but I'm going to have a hard time taking care of them.

M: I'll help you out. Just call me anytime you need my help.

W: Thanks. But still, it's not going to be easy.

M: Don't worry about it. They will bring you so much happiness and laughter.

6번입니다. 대화를 듣고, TV가 배달될 요일을 고르세요.

M: Golden Hill Electronics, how may I help you?

W: Hello. I bought a TV set the other day but it hasn't been delivered yet.

M: OK, may I have your name please?

W: This is Jessy Benson.

M: Oh, hi, Ms. Benson. Well, we actually visited you this Tuesday but no one answered the door.

W: Oh! Wasn't it supposed to be delivered yesterday?

M: No, it was Wednesday yesterday, and as posted we close our business on Wednesdays.

W: Oh, my! I'm sorry. Can you reschedule the delivery?

M: Sure. Would tomorrow work for you?

W: Sorry, but how about the next day?

M: No problem. We'll be at your door at ten in the morning. How's that?

W: Great. Thanks!

7번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 남자의 심정으로 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

W: John, what's up? You look worried.

M: I think I made a huge mistake. I met Jane the other day. She said she had gained some weight, and I told her she looked overweight and should go on a diet. Since then, she has been avoiding me.

W: You should be more careful when you mention weight around girls, especially Jane. She's very sensitive to that issue.

M: I thought she wanted a frank opinion from me.

W: Don't you know sometimes you need to tell lies? I mean white lies.

M: Yeah, I think I should have done that.

8번입니다. 전화 대화 후에 여자가 할 일을 고르세요.

(Telephone rings)

W: Dad, it's Sujin. We start boarding in 20 minutes.

M: Sujin, did you confirm the reservation for the hotel in London?

W: Yes. I did. One of the teachers at the sister school will pick me up at the airport and take me to the hotel.

M: Good. Do you have some chewing gum? It will help your ears with the popping on the plane.

W: Don't worry. I have some. I'll be all right.

M: OK, then, make sure you have your boarding pass with you. And don't forget to call me as soon as you get there, and...

W: All right, all right, Dad. I've gotta go. They are lining up at the departure gate.

M: Well, take care of yourself and enjoy your cultural exchange program in London.

W: Thank you, Dad.

9번입니다. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 광고하고 있는 제품을 고르세요.

M:

11번입니다. 다음을 듣고, 여자가 제안하는 것으로 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

W:

12번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 대화하고 있는 장소를 고르세요.

M: Wow... This place is so big. I don't know where to start.

W: Is this your first time here?

M: Yes, I signed up for a membership yesterday.

W: Well, you picked a good place. I've been coming here for three years.

M: There are so many different kinds of machines here. Which one should I use first?

W: It depends on you. What's your purpose for coming here?

M: I just want to lose some weight. I've gained too much lately.

W: Then, you have to use a treadmill first. It'll help you burn some calories.

13번입니다. 다음을 듣고, 방송에서 언급한 내용이 아닌 것을 고르세요.

Good morning. These are the main headlines this morning. Today a cloud of yellow dust blowing in from China is expected to sweep through the whole country. President Lee Myung-bak says the Group of 20 member states has agreed to keep in "close contact" to support the victims of the massive earthquake in Haiti that has killed hundreds of thousands. Four traditional Korean dishes have been approved for consumption by astronauts in space. These include "kimchi," "bulgogi," "bibimbap," and mulberry juice. Korea and the United States are working together to help develop poor countries in an effort to broaden their partnership. In spite of the global economic crisis and the H1N1 flu scare around the world, there was a significant increase of foreign tourists visiting Korea in 2009. Details will be provided a little later.

14번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 대화의 내용과 일치하지 않는 것을 고르세요.

W: Good morning. May I help you?

W: Okay, which courses are you interested in?

M: I'm interested in a writing course.

W: We operate two camps, one in July, the other in August. Which one would you like to enroll in?

W: We also offer optional afternoon classes: pronunciation or cross-cultural communication. Would you like to take one?

M: Sure. I'll take cross-cultural communication. I'd also like to purchase meal tickets for students.

W: Alright. For lodging, where would you stay? You can stay either in the dormitory or with a homestay family. We can arrange a local homestay for you.

15번입니다. 다음을 듣고, 제품의 특징으로 언급되지 않은 것을 고르세요.

M:

Have you heard about electronic readers? These notebook-sized devices can hold more than 1,000 books! Most e-readers are easy to carry around, weighing less than 500 grams. You can download an e-book in a minute for a much lower price than buying the printed book itself. You can carry all the e-books with you wherever you go. When you find a word you don't understand while reading, just click on the word to get its definition in a second. You can read e-books in dark places without turning on the light because they provide lights of their own. You don't like to read small print? You can adjust the size in your e-reader to as large as you wish.
