ANN : 이제 시작하겠습니다.

1번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자가 구입한 티켓의 좌석을 고르세요.

M: How may I help you, ma'am?

W: I want to buy two tickets for tonight.

M: We have sections S, A, B, and C, as you can see on this chart.  
Which section do you prefer?

W: I don't like side seats, and section S seems quite expensive.

M: OK. Then you have two choices: section A and section B.

W: I don't want to be too close to the stage. So I will go for the seats in section B.

M: That will be £80. Here are your tickets. Section B, front row. I think that will be the perfect place to enjoy the play.

2번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 남자가 전화를 건 목적을 고르세요.

(A telephone rings)

W: Golden Express Movers. What can I do for you?

M: I'm moving to a new apartment next week, and I'd like to know the price.

W: It depends on the type of service. Do you want us to pack for you?

M: No, I'll have things packed and ready to go. I just need you to move everything, including furniture and appliances.

M: Next Saturday, the 22nd of September.

W: We are available next Saturday. If it's okay, we'll come to your house and give you an estimate in advance.

3번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자가 지불할 금액을 고르세요.

M: May I help you?

W: Yes, I'm looking for a digital camera. Can you tell me about this model?

M: Oh, it's our best-selling model. It's very easy to operate, and the price is quite reasonable. It's \$300, and just for today, you can get 20% off.

W: Really? That sounds good. I have only \$250, and I've really wanted to get this camera.

M: This is a great chance to get a wonderful camera at a good price.

W: I have an additional 5%-off coupon. Can I use this coupon, too?

M: I'm afraid you can't. It has expired.

W: Oh, what a shame! I'll take it anyway, and I'll still have \$10 left.

4번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 대화하는 장소를 고르세요.

W: It's so beautiful!

M: I agree. The contrast between the flowers and the pale blue background is also amazing.

W: How about this self-portrait?

5번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 남자의 현재 직업을 고르세요.

W: So, how did you get into your current job?

M: In my high school days, I was crazy about rock music, and I needed some money to buy a drum. Then my mom gave me a part-time job at her salon.

W: What did you do there?

M: Hmm... Washed people's hair and cleaned the shop.

W: Did you like it?

M: Washing and cleaning? No way! (chuckle) But my mother was impressed with my suggestions on how to style her customers' hair.

W: It must have made you feel proud of yourself. And that's how you got into this profession.

6번입니다.

W: What do we have next period?

M: But the teacher said 2 weeks ago that we would have a jump-rope test.

7번입니다.

W: I'm sorry, but she's not here at the moment. Who's calling, please?

M: This is Fred. Do you happen to know when she'll be back?

W: She's gone to the bookstore, but she'll be back soon. Do you want me to take a message for you?

M: Yes, please. We were supposed to meet for our social studies project at 2 this afternoon. But my mom has the flu, and I'm afraid I can't make it today.

W: Oh, that's too bad. Would you like Jane to call you when she gets back?

M: That would be great. Thanks.

W: No problem.

8번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자가 당황해하는 이유를 고르세요.

M: What's wrong? You look upset.

W: I locked myself out again.

M: Where did you leave your keys?

W: I mean, I accidentally locked the car door with the keys still inside.

M: Don't you have any spare keys in your purse?

W: The thing is, I left my purse on the passenger seat in my car.

M: Then call the emergency service. They will come and sort it all out.

W: Why didn't I think of that? I'll call them now. I hope they come soon.

M: Don't worry. They'll come in no time.

9번입니다.

다음을 듣고, 승무원이 안내하고 있는 사항과 관련이 없는 것을 고르세요.

W: Ladies and gentlemen, welcome aboard Flight 747 to New York. We hope you are enjoying your flight with us. Please be sure to fasten your seat belt while the emergency light is on and while you are seated. Your carry-on luggage should not block the aisles and should be safely stored in the overhead compartment or under the seat in front of you. 10번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 무엇에 관한 내용인지 고르세요.

M: At the end of the year, there will be a presidential election. Will you vote?

W: Of course not. We are too young to vote.

M: I don't understand why the voting age is so high. I want to be able to help select our next president.

W: Wait until you graduate from high school. 17-year-olds are not mature enough.

M: If we could vote, maybe politicians would value students' opinions more highly.

W: Allowing teenagers to vote could be dangerous because teens are easily influenced.

M: I understand. But some teens work and pay taxes. Those guys should be able to vote.

W: But they represent only a few teens. Most teens are too busy with schoolwork and exams to worry about politics.

11번입니다.

W: Son, I have a few things to tell you before I go on this trip. When you wash the dishes, you'd better start with the glasses.

M: Why, mom? Can't I wash the dishes in any order?

W: Dishes are usually greasy, but water glasses are relatively clean.

M: I see. How about cleaning the rooms?
