W: You put a tremendous amount of pressure on your feet every day. So, you should give serious thought to the type of shoes you wear, especially while playing sports. Wearing the right shoes can help protect one's feet and ankles and guard against injury. Depending on the sport, varying amounts of pressure will be put on your feet. Thus, you need shoes that provide different types of support. For example, because you pound your feet while running, you need to look for shoes that have excellent heel support and extra cushioning to absorb the constant shock. Unlike running that repeats straight-ahead motions, tennis and aerobics require side-to-side movements. So, you need special shoes that offer additional foot support for such movement. Lastly, basketball demands extra stability and support when running and jumping on the court. That's why you have to wear basketball shoes on the court. All athletic shoes are not equal in their functions. I hope you wear the right shoes when playing sports.
