ANN : 이제 시작하겠습니다.

1번입니다.

대화를 듣고, Kate가 입고 있는 발레복을 고르세요.

W: Look, Kate's up next.

(clapping sound)

M: Which one is she? All the ballerinas on stage look the same.

W: Look, over there. She's the one with the short sleeves.

M: Do you mean the one wearing a skirt with a black line at the bottom?

W: No. Not her. Kate's wearing a layered skirt.

M: Does she have a big ribbon around her waist?

W: Yeah, that's her.

M: Oh, she looks so cute. Pass me the camera.

2번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자의 심정으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

M: How can I help you?

W: I bought this shirt last weekend.

M: Is there a problem with it?

W: I think it's too tight.

M: We have some different sizes. Would you like to try on a larger one?

W: I don't think so. Can I just get a refund?

M: I'm sorry, I'm afraid not.

W: What do you mean? I have the receipt.

M: Look at the notice, please. "No refunds after three days."

W: That's ridiculous! You should have told me that when I bought it.

3번입니다.

다음을 듣고, 무엇에 관한 설명인지 고르세요.

M: It is a natural disaster. It is a shaking of the ground that results in damage to buildings and other structures. It is most dangerous when followed by landslides, fires, or tsunamis. For example, in San Francisco, more deaths were caused by fire than by the disaster itself. Many houses were destroyed: killing and injuring a lot of people and leaving many homeless. Experts say Korea is not safe enough from the danger of it.

4번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자가 지불할 금액을 고르세요.

M: Welcome to Tea House.

W: I'm looking for a present for my uncle. He really likes herbal teas.

M: Then how about this tea? It has a calming smell that helps relieve stress.

W: That sounds nice. How much is it?

M: It's 20 dollars.

W: Great. I'll take 2. I also have a coupon for 5 dollars off.

M: I'm afraid this coupon expired last week. Instead, we are offering this green tea as a free gift. It's a three-dollar value.

7번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자가 도서관에 온 이유를 고르세요.

W: Hi, John. Nice to see you. What are you doing here?

M: I came to return some books. What about you? Are you here to borrow books?

W: No. Actually, I'm here for an interview for a part time job.

M: I heard they were looking for a librarian assistant.

W: Yes. They need someone to help sort books during summer vacation.

M: What time is your interview?

W: 2 o'clock.

M: Good luck. Look! Isn't that Mary over there?

W: I think so. I haven't seen her for ages.

M: Me, neither. Let's go and talk to her.

8번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 두 사람의 관계로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

10번입니다.

M: Good afternoon. May I help you?

M: What time do you want to leave?

W: Anytime after 2 is fine.

M: Well, we have a Mugunghwa leaving at 2:10.

W: How much is it and when does it arrive?

M: It's 28,000 Won and it arrives around 7:30.

W: Oh, that's a bit late.

M: Well, we have a KTX leaving at 2:20.

W: Good. How much is it?

M: It's 51,000 Won.

W: Oh. That's too expensive. Let's go with the first one.

W: Hey, Brad, what was your final grade in English Composition?

M: Mr. Kennedy gave me a lower grade than I expected.

W: Why? You did all the homework.

M: I know. He even entered one of my essays into a contest.

W: Why did he give you a low grade?

M: He said I missed too many classes.

W: How many did you miss?

M: Only four.

W: Wow, he's really strict.

13번입니다.

W: David! Where are you now?

M: I'm sorry. I'm on my way home. The meeting didn't finish until 6 o'clock.
