ANN : 여러분 안녕하십니까? 지금부터 전국 15개 시·도교육청이 공동으로 주관하는 2010학년도 제 2회 고등학교 2학년 영어 듣기능력 평가를 시작하겠습니다. 교실에 계시는 선생님들께서는 라디오의 음량을 알맞게 조절해 주시고, 학생 여러분은 답안지에 반, 번호 그리고 이름을 써넣으시기 바랍니다. 모든 문제는 한 번씩만 들려드리니, 잘 듣고 지시에 따라 물음에 답하시기 바랍니다.

ANN : 이제 시작하겠습니다.

1번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 주문할 컵으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

(Phone rings.)

M: Hi, Dream's Gift Shop. How may I help you?

W: I'd like to get some cups for our major customers.

M: What kind of cups are you looking for?

W: I'd like cups with handles. Also, I want them to have lids on top.

M: OK, cups with handles and lids. Would you like to put your company logo on them?

W: Sure. Our company logo is "J & T."

M: Where would you like to put the logo?

W: Just on the body of the cup, not on the lid, please.

M: I see. We'll put "J & T" only on the body of the cup. It's going to be five dollars per cup.

W: Great! I'll order 100 cups.

2번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 남자의 심정으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

M: Are you sure we were supposed to meet her at three?

W: I'm sure. She told me she'd be waiting for us here.

M: Did you tell her we'd pick her up in front of Tom's Bakery?

W: Of course. I double-checked it with her.

M: We've been waiting here for 30 minutes. We may miss our plane.

W: It's strange. She's never late for an appointment.

M: Just call her and see where she is now.

W: All right. Oh, I left my cell phone at home!

M: Then you can use my phone.

W: Uh, well, I don't have her phone number.

M: What are we supposed to do now? I'm not sure we can even start our trip!

3번입니다. 다음을 듣고, 무엇에 대하여 이야기하고 있는지 고르세요.

M: It is light brown, yellow or white. It became popular as a snack in the 1930s during the Great Depression because it was very cheap. In addition to its use as a snack, some people use this as a decoration during Christmas time by hanging it around Christmas trees. These days, it is hard to imagine seeing a movie without this. It is traditionally salted and buttered but can be sweetened with caramel, which kids like most. The name of this is taken after the sound it makes, when the corn explodes due to heat and high pressure.

4번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 여자를 위해 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

(School bell rings.)

M: It's next period. You can buy maps in the bookstore during lunch.
W: But I have to take the quiz!
M: Tell you what. I can go get it for you right after eating lunch.
W: Really? You're a lifesaver.

5번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 남자에게 지불할 총 금액을 고르세요.

W: Hi, I'd like to access a computer. Are there any available?
M: Sure, you can use one of the computers over there.
W: Thank you. How much do you charge?
M: It's three dollars per hour. How many hours are you planning to use it?
W: I need to use it for just two hours.
M: I see. Anything else?
W: Can I get something to drink?
M: Sure. We have coffee and orange juice.
W: Then, I'll have coffee, please. How much is it?
M: It's one dollar, but since you'll use the computer for two hours, you can have it for free.
W: Great! I appreciate it.

W: I missed the last bus so I have no choice but to wait here for the train.

five minutes further away.

M: Me, too. Bye.

10번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 대화 직후에 남자가 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

W: Hello, thank you for calling ABC Telecom. How may I help you?

M: I'd like to cancel my cell phone service.

W: Oh, I see. May I have your name, please?

M: My name is Jack Smith.

W: Thank you, Mr. Smith. First, you need to fill out the cancellation form and send it to us.

M: Can I get the form on your company website?

W: Of course you can. You can download it and print it out.

M: Can I fax it?

W: Sure. Please fax the form along with a copy of your driver's license.

M: I see. I'll do it right away.

W: Thanks. Can you please call me after you fax them?

M: Sure. No problem.
