1. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 찍을 사진의 대상을 고르시오.

M: Sally, did you finish cooking? I'm ready to take a picture.

W: Yes. Have a look. It's just a simple dish made with eggs.

M: It looks great. Now you need a special plate.

W: Yes. I'm going to use this heart-shaped plate. What do you think?

M: The plate looks lovely, but it's too plain to post on the blog.

W: Then let me decorate the dish with these flowers.

M: They don't go well with the food. How about using the egg container over there?

W: Egg container? Let's try that. I'll put them in the lid of the egg container.

M: Are you going to leave the holes empty?

W: Let me think. Oh, how about putting some eggs into the holes?

M: That's a good idea... but if you fill all the holes, it won't look good.

W: You're right. I'll leave half the holes empty. *[Pause]* It's done now. Do you like it?

M: Yeah. Let me take a picture now.

M: Yes, I have. But I'm afraid I haven't looked closely enough.

W: Then let's check his room again.

M: Okay. Will you look in the drawers? I'll check the toy box again.

W: Yes. I hope we find it this time.

M: *[Pause]* Honey, I got it! It's inside the toy car.

3. 다음을 듣고, 여자가 하는 말의 주제로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: The chemistry lab could be an interesting class, but it's one of the most dangerous places at school. Although you follow the safety rules in the lab, accidents may happen.
