1번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자가 역에서 만날 남자를 고르세요.

[Telephone rings]

W: Do you think I will recognize you at the station? We haven't seen each other for ages! I'm sure you've changed a lot.

M: Well, I've grown a lot since we last met.

W: Really? What do you look like now?

M: Before, my hair was straight, but I've had it permed. I used to wear glasses, but now I wear contact lenses. I've also grown a beard.

W: Wow, it sounds like you've grown into a real man.

M: Now, tell me about yourself.

2번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 대화하는 장소를 고르세요.

W: May I help you?

M: Yes. I need a car for a few days, please.

W: Sure. How long do you need it for?

M: I need it from Monday until Wednesday. It's our wedding anniversary and we're traveling.

W: Certainly, sir. We have special rates for the weekdays.

M: That's perfect.

W: Will you be the only driver?

M: No. My wife will also be driving.

W: Okay. Would you like a small car?

M: Well, yes. There'll only be two of us.

W: Okay, do you want to leave it at the airport when you are finished?

M: No, we'll be staying in the city for a few more days, so I would like to leave it at the branch in the city.

3번입니다.

4번입니다.

6번입니다.

7번입니다.

W: That's too bad. I was looking forward to Central Park Zoo, but it won't be much fun in the rain. How about a museum?

M: Good idea. I've got this week's magazine. Let's see what the "Going on about Town" page has to say.

W: How about the National Museum? Is there anything interesting going on there this week?

M: A special exhibit about Russia.

W: Oh, look here. The Art Center has a Vincent van Gogh exhibition.

M: Van Gogh! He's my favorite painter!

W: Let's go there.

8번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 대학 지원 시에 필수 제출서류가 아닌 것을 고르세요.

16번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자가 남자에게 제안하는 것을 고르세요.

M: Really? What did it say?
