ANN: 그러면 지금부터 3교시 외국어 영역 듣기 및 말하기 평가를 시작하겠습니다. 1번부터 13번 문제까지는 듣고 답하는 문제이며, 14번부터 17번까지는 말하고자 하는 내용을 답지에서 골라 답하는 문제입니다. 방송을 잘 듣고 답을 하시기 바랍니다. 듣는 내용은 한번만 방송됩니다.

1. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 제작할 마스코트를 고르시오.

M: Hey, Jenny, do you know our school is holding a mascot design contest for the *No Bully Campaign*?

W: Sure. The grand prize winner can get a scholarship.

M: Then, why don't we go for it together?

W: That's exactly what I wanted. How about making a boy and a girl holding hands?

M: Not bad. But if they put their arms around each other's shoulders, they'll look closer.

W: Oh, I like it! Why don't we use different accessories to show they are a boy and a girl?

M: Good. How about a flower-shaped pin for the girl and a cap for the boy?

W: Well, I prefer a ribbon for the girl.

M: OK. And let's put the slogan "Love Friends" on their T-shirts.

W: Brilliant! But how about splitting the words? I mean "Love" on the girl's and "Friends" on the boy's.

M: Great. It'll make the slogan stand out.

2. 대화를 듣고, 남자의 심정으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Hey, David. You look tired. Didn't you sleep well?

M: Actually I couldn't sleep a wink the whole night.

W: Really? How come?

M: You know I applied for the position of web designer in Tech Village. The company will post the list of new employees today.

W: Oh, today is the big day. How do you feel? Do you think you'll get the position?

M: I have no idea. You know I was rejected last time.

W: I'm sure you can get the job this time. You prepared really hard.

M: But I don't think I did well in the final interview. I kept stumbling over my words.

W: The other applicants probably did too. Don't trouble yourself unnecessarily.

M: I know it's no use thinking about what I can't control. But I can't help it.

3. 다음을 듣고, 무엇에 관한 설명인지 고르시오.

**M:** You can see these people in courts. They are called to proceed the trial, or to help set a penalty or final judgement. They decide whether an accused person is guilty or not. They are intended to be an impartial panel capable of reaching a judgement, so there are some requirements. For example, they should have a sound mind, clean records with no crime and a clear understanding of the country's language, etc. They are chosen randomly from the qualified common people living in an area where a court has authority.

4. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: You know what? Su-jin is getting married.

W: Oh, really? When is the wedding?

M: In August. She said she's going to send us invitations soon.

W: Great. Well, what can we do to congratulate the newlyweds?

M: How about singing a song at the wedding?

W: Ooh, as you know, I'm not a good singer, but I can play the guitar to your song. I'd really like to surprise her.

M: That would be a great present for her.

W: Do you have any particular song in mind? I'll need some time to practice it.

M: I have a list of wedding songs on my computer. I'll print it out and you can take a look.

W: Sounds great. I'm so excited.

5. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 신용카드로 지불할 금액을 고르시오.

W: Good afternoon. What can I do for you?

M: When is the show time of *Wonderful Days*?

W: We have shows at 6:30 and 8:20.

M: Good. I want two tickets for the earlier one.

W: Each ticket is eight dollars, so it'll be 16 dollars altogether.

M: OK, here's my membership card. Can you check the mileage points?

W: No problem. *[Pause]* It's 1,200 points.

M: Oh, I didn't know I'd saved that many. I'd like to use some now.

W: Sure. One point means one cent, so you have 12 dollars in total. How many points do you want to use?

W: Hello?

M: Hi, Claire. It's Henry. Do you remember when our group meeting is?

W: It's 10 a.m. tomorrow.

M: Ah... I confused tomorrow with the day after tomorrow.

W: It can happen sometimes. By the way, how long do you think the meeting will last?

M: Well, I guess it'll end before noon. We'll just assign roles to each member.

W: Then, what are you up to after that?

M: Not much. I'm just thinking I'll go to the library for my science report. Why?

W: Well, I'm going to the department store after the meeting. Can you go with me?

M: Sure. I can borrow books later. Are you going to buy something?

W: Yes, I'm going to get my brother something for his graduation. But you know,  
I have no idea about men's taste.

M: No problem. I'll be glad to help you.

8. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 대화하고 있는 장소로 가장 적절한 곳을 고르시오.

W: Yes, I can feel the breeze. This was a lovely idea.

M: I'm so glad you like it.

W: Look! You can see dolphins jumping out of the water.

M: Yeah! They look fantastic.

W: How far is it to the island?

M: It takes about half an hour. You'll see the dock soon. Later on, the guide will tell us about the island in detail.

W: Hang on a moment. Look at the birds and beautiful white waves behind us.

M: Cool! We can also see the coasts on both sides. Isn't it good to stay here on the deck?

W: Right. The engine makes a noise downstairs and it's too stuffy. I like it up here.

M: It seems the guide is starting his explanation. Let's go and listen to him.
