ANN : 이제 시작하겠습니다.

1번입니다. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 사려고 하는 넥타이를 고르세요.

W: Wow! There are a huge variety of fancy neckties.

M: That's great. I need to buy a necktie for my dad.

W: Really? Let's choose one here. What kind do you want?

M: Hmm. How about this polka-dot necktie?

W: It looks nice, but I'm not sure if your father likes polka dots. What about this solid one?

M: Do you mean the solid and wide tie? Wide ties are a little bit old-fashioned.

W: Okay. You don't like wide ones. Hmm. Here are some narrow ties. You can see if there's something you like.

M: They are very stylish. I like them. Which pattern do you think is the best?

W: Hmm... Look! This checkered tie is eye-catching. It will make your dad look much younger, I think.

M: You're right. Checks are very trendy these days. I'll take this one.

2번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자의 현재 심정으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

M: I heard you've moved into a new apartment. What made you choose this apartment?

W: The rent is six hundred dollars a month. You know this price is really reasonable.

M: But if it isn't furnished, it's not that cheap.

W: It's furnished. There are a bed, a sofa and a refrigerator.

M: What do you mean by that? Do you have any problem with your apartment?

M: Did you complain to your neighbor about the noise?

W: Of course, but they ignored me. What is worse, I hear a lot of traffic noise from outside.

M: The constant noise must bother you a lot. How do you put up with that noise all day long?

W: There's no other way. Maybe I should go to the realtor for another apartment.

3번입니다. 다음을 듣고, 무엇에 관한 설명인지 고르세요.

W: This is a form of entertainment that includes something for just about everyone. As a traveling company of clowns, acrobats, trained animals, musicians and a range of other performers, this enjoys a history that goes back to the prime of the Roman Empire. Generally, the focus of the performing area is referred to as a ring, owing to the circular nature of the space. Also, there is always a ringmaster who introduces all the performances. Because these are traveling companies, tents are used for much of the live performances and housing for the animals and props. These tents are nicknamed the "Big top".

4번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

W: How late do you think you'll be? We have 30 minutes before the movie starts.

W: That's all right. I should ask for a refund on tickets.

M: Wait! How about seeing it tomorrow? I'm free after 3 p.m.

W: Okay, then I'll exchange the tickets. Did you say you're available after 3?

M: Yes, you're right.

W: Then, see you tomorrow afternoon.

M: Okay.

5번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 지불할 총액을 고르세요.

M: How can I help you?

W: I'd like to buy an MP3 player. The item number is Ay-15

M: Could you wait for a second, please? (pause) Here you are. This is selling like hot cakes these days.

W: How much is this?

M: The original price is one hundred dollars.

W: I have a coupon from the magazine. Take a look at this, please.

M: OK. With this, I can give you 30% discount off the fixed price. Do you need anything else?

W: Oh, I need a vehicle recharger. Is there any special event for that?

M: Yes, there is. One recharger is twenty dollars. But, we're currently offering two rechargers for the price of thirty dollars.

W: (reluctantly) Sounds great, but I need only one.

M: OK. One MP3 player with a coupon and one recharger. Here you are.
