ANN : 이제 시작하겠습니다.

1번입니다.

대화를 듣고, Cathy의 선생님이 누구인지 고르세요.

W: Hi, Bob. Long time no see.

M: Nice to see you again, Cathy! How have you been?

W: Good. I've been so busy studying Korean.

M: Good to hear that. We'll probably be able to talk in Korean soon.

W: Probably not. I need more practice.

M: Are you studying at a Korean language academy?

W: Yes, I am studying at Hangeul Academy.

M: Hangeul Academy? I also went there. Who is your instructor?

W: Ms. Kim.

M: The older lady who has long curly hair and wears glasses?

W: Well, my instructor has long curly hair, but she doesn't wear glasses.

M: Aha! Now I remember her.

2번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 대화하고 있는 장소를 고르세요.

M: Could you tell me exactly what you saw?

W: When I was standing right here, waiting for the bus, there was a squeaking sound. Then I looked around and saw two cars crashing into each other.

M: Did you see the traffic light?

W: Yes, do you see that one over there in front of the bank? I'm sure it was red because I was looking in that direction to see if the bus was coming.

M: Thank you for your help. Can I have your phone number just in case?

W: My number is 010-123-4567.

3번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 두 사람의 관계를 가장 잘 나타낸 것을 고르세요.

W: You look upset. What's wrong?

M: It's my mom. She just doesn't understand me.

W: Oh, Jason. Come over here and sit down. (Pause) Now tell me.

M: I came home at 10 last night. It was not that late, but she kept scolding me and said she wouldn't let me go out with my friends again.

W: Jason, I don't think 10 p.m. is that early.

M: OK. But she wouldn't listen to me.

W: I know how you feel. Your mom and I were also scolded by your grandmother for coming home late when we were young.

M: Really?

W: Yes. But, now I understand it was for our own good.

4번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 남자의 현재 심경을 가장 잘 나타낸 것을 고르세요.

W: Kevin, what's up?

M: Kind of. Nowadays, I'm helping Professor Brown's research as his assistant.

8번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 휴대전화요금에 많이 나온 이유를 고르세요.

W: Good morning, Super Telecom. How may I help you?

M: Hi, I'm calling about my last cell-phone bill. I think I've been overcharged.

W: May I have your name and number, please?

M: It's Tyler Jones, 090-2341-0710.

W: OK, Mr. Jones. You were charged \$300 this month.

M: Right, but why was I charged \$200 for Internet service?

W: You used it for 90 hours.

M: But I'm only supposed to pay \$50 a month for the unlimited Internet service.

W: That service was for a special promotion. It expired last month.

9번입니다.
