**ANN** : 이제 시작하겠습니다.

1번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 사려고 하는 램프를 고르세요.

M: Mom, look. There are neat lamps over there. Can I get one for my room?

W: Well, I see you up late studying recently.

M: Don't you know I am preparing for the final exam? My eyes get easily tired under the dim light.

W: I see. What about the lamp with a broad and rectangular shade?

M: Not bad. But the triangular shaped shade looks nicer to me.

W: OK. What about the bottom? Why don't you choose the one with a small base?

M: That's a good idea. The smaller base could save more space on my desk.

W: You're right. Your desk is always messy scattered with books and stuff.

M: Mom. Look at that triangle-shaped lamp with a joint in its neck.

W: You mean that one which is adjustable at its neck?

M: Uh-uh. It will be more convenient if I can adjust the direction of the light.

W: Definitely. Let's get that one.

2번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자의 심정으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

W: Oh, my goodness! I can't believe it!

M: What's the matter, Jenny?

W: Look at this flyer from ABC shopping mall. All the clothing items are on sale.

M: That's great news. What's wrong with that?

W: I bought this black coat 3 weeks ago at a regular price. Now it's 30% off.

M: Oh, I'm sorry to hear that. Didn't you ask the clerk if there would be any sale soon?

W: I did, but she said there would be no sale for the next 3 months. That's why I bought it.

M: How could she do that? She gave you the wrong information.

W: Now other people are buying the same coat at a much lower price. I should do something about it.

3번입니다. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 주제로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

M: Within the first few days of starting college, many students quickly learn that managing their time is one of the most challenging tasks. Here are a few tips for managing your time well in college. First, get and use a planner. It can be a paper planner, a cell phone or a PDA. No matter what kind it is, make sure you have one. Second, write down everything in one place. Having multiple planners only makes you confused and disorganized. Finally, prioritize your tasks. Always ask yourself "What has to be done first?" and "What is worth more in terms of your grade?"

4번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 여자를 위해 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

M: What's wrong with your hand?

W: I hurt it yesterday. It's swollen and it hurts to move my fingers.

M: You should get someone to look at it. It sounds serious to me.

W: But, I have to finish typing this for a presentation tomorrow.

M: How much of it is done?

W: Only about half. I have to work on it all night.

M: Typing all this with a swollen hand? It could get worse.

W: All right. I got it. Where do you recommend I go, then?

M: There is Dr. Stevens in the Penny Building. Just 10 minutes by car.

W: I don't feel like driving. I'd best take a taxi.

M: I am on my way out now. I will drop you off there.

5번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 지불할 금액을 고르세요.

W: What can I help you with?

M: Do you think this stain can be removed by dry-cleaning?

W: What did you spill? It looks like blue ink.

M: My little boy accidentally opened a fountain pen and splashed the ink onto it.

W: No problem. We can take care of it.

M: How much does it cost to have this jacket dry-cleaned?

W: Generally, we charge 20 dollars for a jacket. But a leather jacket will cost 30 dollars.

M: I wish leather wasn't so expensive to clean. These two pants also need ironing.

W: They don't need dry-cleaning? Just ironing?

M: Yes. One leather jacket for dry-cleaning, two pants for ironing.

W: Ironing for one piece is just 10 dollars.

6번입니다. 다음을 듣고, 여자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

W: Interested in making a difference in your community? One of the best places to volunteer may be right near you: an animal shelter. With funding problems and overpopulation, animal shelters face challenges every day. However, their biggest struggle comes from the lack of volunteers. You can help by volunteering to work at animal shelters in your spare time. Get started! Whether you play with dogs and cats, clean cages and supplies, or assist with a fundraising event, you can make a big difference in the lives of animals.

7번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 여자에게 부탁한 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

W: Hello?

M: Mom, I can't find my library card anywhere. I'm at the library to check out some books.

W: Oh, dear. I found your card in the wet laundry today. It's torn and not usable.

M: Again? What shall I do? I need it right now.

W: How many times did I tell you to empty your pockets?

M: I'm sorry, mom. Please, tell me what to do.

W: Just get a new one there. All you need is just a photo of you. Do you have one with you now?

M: No. But I scanned my photo and saved it on the desktop computer.

W: Do you want me to send it to you?

M: Yes. Could you please check the folder on the computer and send the file to me by e-mail?

W: OK. I will try it now. Go and ask a librarian where you can access the Internet.

M: Thanks, Mom.

8번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 대화하고 있는 장소로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

W: Wow! We barely got in.

M: Whew. What if we missed this one? We wouldn't have made it to the concert.

W: We should have been more careful about time. We spent too much time shopping.

M: Come on, it was you who wanted to go to the department store.

W: Well, it was you who bought a lot. I bought only one.

M: OK. OK. Anyway we are on the way to the concert. No one to be blamed.

W: That's right. I'm so tired. I have sore feet from too much walking.

M: Take a nap then. I will wake you up at the stop.

W: By the way, do you see the sign on the wall? This is a designated area only for women.

M: What? That's why all the ladies here are staring at me.

W: Let's move ahead to the next car of the train.

9번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람의 관계를 가장 잘 나타낸 것을 고르세요.

M: The movie was terrific. Did you expect this movie would be such a big success?

W: No, not at all. Before releasing this movie, I was so nervous. Much more than when I was acting in films.

M: Ha ha. How could you create all those impressive sound and special effects?

W: Well, I was just lucky enough to have all the technicians and experts involved in the movie.

M: I think they were lucky, too. Let's move on. What inspired you to make this sci-fi movie?

W: My favorite book "*Dragon*." I've dreamed of making it into a movie.

10번입니다. 다음을 듣고, 무엇에 관한 설명인지 고르세요.

M: If you want to get this, the first thing you have to do is fill out an application form. You might need a few photos. If you don't want to miss that performance, don't forget to join us on the first day of the festival. Admission ticket is normally 12 dollars but you can get one for 10 dollars if you book online. The handicapped and children under 7 will be granted free admission.
