ANN: 그럼 이제 시작 하겠습니다.

1번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여학생이 구입하려고 하는 휴대폰 고리를 고르세요.

W: Hi, I'm looking for a cell phone accessory. I saw a nice one here last week.

M: Was it this one with a pig? It's very popular.

W: Well, I saw a heart-shaped one.

M: You mean this one with a rose in the center?

W: Right! Oh, it costs more than I thought.

M: What about this cat ornament? It's very cute and the price is very  
reasonable.

W: Isn't it too ordinary? I want something unique and distinctive.

M: Then, how about this one with a mirror? They come in square and round  
shapes. You can also put a picture in it.

W: Perfect! I like the square one. How much is it?

M: It's 6,000 won but we can give you a 10% discount if you have our  
membership card.

W: Sounds great! Here it is.

## 2번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 대화하고 있는 장소를 고르세요.

M: How are you Mrs. Baker? Can I help you with anything?

W: Hi, Kevin. My husband and I have planned a camping trip for this weekend. But we realized that some parts of our tent are missing.

M: You should go to the camping equipment section. It's on the third floor. Right next to the golf equipment.

W: I went there already. But I couldn't find the brand of our tent.

M: Did you buy the tent here?

W: Yes. I bought it about 3 years ago.

M: It's possible that we no longer carry that brand. Maybe the manager can help you.

## 3번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 두 사람의 관계로 가장 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

W: Oh, really? Hmm. You need to consider how long you are going to rent a room and how much money you can afford.

**6번입니다.**

**8번입니다.**

M: They live on Pine Street. It takes 25 minutes to get to their house.

**10번입니다.**

**12번입니다.**

M: This is a type of website usually maintained by an individual with regular posts of commentaries, descriptions of events, or other materials such as photos and videos. Some of these provide a commentary or news on a particular subject, while others function as more personal online diaries. A typical form of this combines text, images, and links to other web pages or other media related to its topic. One of the important features is that it's possible for the readers to leave comments, so people can share their ideas with others.
