1번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 남자가 사려고 하는 스피커를 고르세요.

W: May I help you?

M: I need a set of speakers for my daughter's PC.

W: All right. How about these apple-shaped ones?

M: They're very cute but too small.

W: How about these ones?

M: Oh, they're teddy bear-shaped. But my daughter is a high school student.

W: Then, here is a brand new type. They look like a beautiful set of wine glasses.

M: Oh, they're really unique. Hmm, I like them but I don't think they're suitable for my daughter. Could you show me others?

W: How about this ball-shaped one?

M: It looks good, but I am afraid the output is too small.

W: Then how about these rectangular ones? They're very powerful.

M: Perfect! I'll take them.
