1. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 구입할 toy tent를 고르시오. [1점]

M: Honey, are you sure that our twin daughters would like a toy tent?

W: Yes, absolutely.

M: All right. Which one do you like most?

W: How about the dome-shaped one with a shade?

M: Isn't it too complicated to set up?

W: Well, would you prefer the dome-shaped one with a window, instead?

M: Hmm.... Honey, that triangle-shaped one looks simpler.

W: Which one? The one with a round window or with a square window?

M: The one with a round window, but not the one with a shade.

W: Ah! Now I see what you want, but I still prefer the dome-shaped tents.

M: I think the girls would prefer a triangle-shaped one.

W: OK. Then let's get the one with the round window.

2. 대화를 듣고, 남자의 심정으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: That taxi ride was terrible!

W: I know. It was like being on a roller coaster.

M: Are we even at the right place?

W: Uh.... Let me check the map. Here's the post office.... *(Pause)* Oh, no. He dropped us off at the wrong place.

M: Not again. Why does this always happen to us?

W: I know. Well, how are we supposed to get there now?

M: I guess we have to take another taxi, but I really don't want to.

W: Neither do I. Umm.... It doesn't look too far on the map. Why don't we walk?

M: I don't want to walk. My feet hurt.

W: No more talk about it, please. Just walk!

3. 다음을 듣고, 무엇에 관한 설명인지 고르시오.

W: Before this automatic system became popular, people had to go to the bank to pay their bills. It was stressful for them because they had to remember their bills' due dates and find the time to go to the bank. However, thanks to modern technology, the situation has changed. 4. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 할 일을 고르시오.

M: That's possible.

W: Why don't you send him a text message? Even if he's in a meeting, he might be able to reply.

M: That's what I'm just about to do.

M: How long will you be in Beijing?

W: After the meetings, I'm going to do some sightseeing there for two weeks. On Friday, June 24, I'll be home. I'll have my phone service back the next day.

M: OK. Call me then.

M: That's a great performance!

W: Do you think so?

W: I've been practicing this for the last 3 weeks for the B-boy contest. But I have a problem.

M: What's that? I don't think there's anything wrong with it.
