1번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 남자가 주문한 꽃을 고르세요.

(Telephone Rings)

W: Hello, this is Lora at Bella's Flowers. How can I help you today?

M: Hi, I'd like to have some roses delivered to my wife.

W: Great, we sell our roses in singles, half dozens, and dozens.

M: I'd like a half dozen white roses, please.

W: How would you like to have them prepared? We can do special wrappings or can arrange them in a vase.

M: The first option sounds great.

W: We have striped, polka-dotted, and plain wrapping papers.

M: My wife loves polka dots.

W: Would you like a ribbon with your order?

M: That would be great.
