ANN: 이제 시작 하겠습니다.

1번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자가 찾아가려는 남자의 사무실로 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

[Telephone rings]

M: Hello! M&C Law Firm. How may I help you?

W: Well, this is Julia Brown from The Sun Law Firm.

M: Oh! Julia? This is Mike. Where are you now? The meeting is going to begin  
in a minute.

W: I'm sorry. I'm lost. I can't find your office.

M: Where exactly are you right now?

W: I don't know. I only see a big tower on my left.

M: Oh! I see. Then you must be on Pine Street, right?

W: Let me see the street sign. Yes, it's Pine Street.

M: Go straight ahead to the second intersection. You can see a post office on  
the right corner.

W: Uh-huh.

M: Make a right turn on Anderson Street and go one block.

W: Yeah.

M: Then turn left. You will see my office on the left, next to the bank. My  
office is across from city hall. You can't miss it.

W: Thanks a million.

2번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 두 사람의 관계로 가장 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

W: Come this way, please. Now we will look at some works from the Impressionist period.

M: Wow! This is so beautiful. Who painted it?

W: Claude Monet. It's one of his masterpieces. The title is "Garden". You can recognize his representative painting style. You can see the fullness of the garden and the complexity of the scene.

M: Yes! The breeze seems to blow out of the painting. What's in the next room?

W: Well, you can see more works from the other Impressionists.

M: I can't wait to see the Paul Gauguin piece.

W: I will take you to see it in a moment.

3번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자의 심경 변화로 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

W: Excuse me, please. Can you help me?

M: Yes, ma'am. What can I do for you?

W: I've just flown in from New York on BA 606, but my bag hasn't arrived.

M: Flight 606 from New York? Can you describe your bag, please?

W: Yes, it's large, yellow, with a bright green tag.

M: That should make it easier to identify. It'll probably arrive on the next flight.

W: When is that?

M: Tomorrow at 8:00 p.m.

W: Oh dear! Do I have to wait so long? What should I do until then?

M: Don't worry. Please fill out this form and we'll send your bag to your hotel as soon as possible.

4번입니다.

다음을 듣고, 에너지 절약 방안으로 제시되지 않은 것을 고르세요.

W: We should not only pass a law on saving energy but also put it in real practice to cope with the approaching energy crisis. This summer, our government will adopt new measures of saving energy in offices and these measures will first be introduced among government employees. 5번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 대화가 끝난 후 여자가 할 일을 고르세요.

M: Good morning. Please have a seat. What seems to be the problem?

W: I have a terrible stomachache.

M: Do you have diarrhea?

W: Yes, I do.

M: Do you have any other symptoms?

W: Yes, I feel sick.

M: Do you mean you feel nauseous?

W: That's right. I feel like vomiting. And right now I'm feeling dizzy, too.

M: When did the symptoms start?

W: This morning. Last evening I ate raw fish.

M: Alright. Please remove your shirt and lie down here. ... Tell me if it hurts when I do this.

W: No, it doesn't. Ouch! It hurts there.

M: Okay. It seems to just be indigestion.

W: Will I have to be admitted to the hospital?

M: No. I'll give you a prescription for indigestion tablets. Take them for two days. If you don't get better, we'll run some tests.

6번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 메모된 내용이 잘못된 것을 고르세요.

M: Hello. Hillside Inn. May I help you?

W: Yes, I'd like to reserve a single non-smoking room for the 21st of May.

M: Okay. Let me check. The 21st of March, right?

W: No. May, not March.

M: Oh, sorry. Let me see here. Hmmm.

W: Do you have a room available that night?

M: Well, we do have one suite available.

W: How much is it?

M: It's \$300 dollars, plus a 10% room tax.

W: Oh, that's a little too expensive for me.

Do you have any cheaper room available either on the 20th or the 22nd?

M: Sorry, we don't.

W: Okay. I guess I have no choice... I'll take it.

7번입니다.

M: Bill? Well, I met him on the street this morning and he looked happy.

8번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자가 남자에게 충고하는 내용으로 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

W: Oh, my goodness! This heat is unbearable! Why don't you turn on the air-conditioner? It's sweltering in here!

M: I'm sorry. It's broken.

W: Have you tried to get it fixed?

W: You're right. But keeping a diary everyday can be a bother. Why don't you try blogging? It's hot at the moment.

M: I know. But I don't care much for blogs.

W: Why not? Blogging is very easy. You can design the page, upload photos, link to other pages, or add MP3s. You can't do that in a diary.

M: I know what you mean. But blogging is too public. I don't want people to know my private life.

15번입니다.
