1. 대화를 듣고, 남자의 마지막 말에 대한 여자의 응답으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Did you go to the yoga class at the community center yesterday?

W: Yes, I did. But I don't think that class is right for me.

M: Why do you think that?

W: Chris, did you hear that there will be a Latin jazz concert at town hall?

M: Yeah. I have a ticket. I'm going this Friday.

W: Wow! How did you get it? I heard tickets sold out in just ten minutes.

3. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Hello, everyone. This is James Patrick, your student council president. Lately, many students are riding their bicycles to school. That's good for saving the environment, but when bikes are not parked properly, they can cause a lot of inconvenience for others. Please use the space the school provides for bikes behind the auditorium. Don't park them beside benches or trees, because it can make those places uncomfortable for students. Please remember your casual behavior can cause inconvenience for others.

4. 대화를 듣고, 여자의 의견으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: John, how are you doing in Mr. Anderson's social studies class?  
M: Well, he said there will be many debates. I'm already stressed.  
W: When I was in his class, I felt the same way, but I'm sure you'll find them very helpful.  
M: In what way can debating be helpful?  
W: Participating in debates will help improve your logical thinking.  
M: I don't see how.  
W: Debating teaches you to organize ideas logically to make your argument stronger.  
M: I understand, but it still sounds difficult.  
W: With more experience, you'll get better at it.  
M: I see. I'll give it a try.

5. 대화를 듣고, 두 사람의 관계를 가장 잘 나타낸 것을 고르시오.

M: Good morning. How can I help you?  
W: Hi. I bought this recently, but it keeps turning itself off.  
M: Can I see it?  
W: Yes, here it is.  
M: *[Pause]* It's infected with a virus, and that's causing your phone to shut down.  
W: I see. Can it be fixed?  
M: Yes, but if the virus cannot be removed, your cell phone will need to be reset.  
W: What will happen to all the applications and files on my phone if it is reset?  
M: Don't worry. I will back up all your apps and files before I repair your phone.  
W: I appreciate that. When can I pick it up?  
M: It'll be done by 4 p.m.. You can come back to the service center after that.

6. 대화를 듣고, 그림에서 대화의 내용과 일치하지 않는 것을 고르시오.

W: Peter, your new classroom looks fantastic!  
M: We've just finished decorating this room. Beside the door, the whiteboard is on the wall. It has two speakers above it.  
W: Oh, what's that big tree on the wall next to the notice board?  
M: It's a reading tree. I collected my students' book reviews and made them into a tree.  
W: Good idea. I should try that in my class. Are those two computers under the clock for students to use?  
M: Yes. Students can search the Internet freely during project lessons. They can also use the books in the bookshelf next to the computers.  
W: How convenient! I like the round desks in the center of the room.  
M: They are specially designed for group work.  
W: Impressive. Your students will love the changes to your classroom.

7. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: What are you doing, Chuck? You look worried.  
M: I am, Mom. I'm supposed to come up with a new idea for my science project.  
W: What kind of new idea?  
M: Mr. Choi wants us to think of a new invention to use around the house.  
W: Do you have anything in mind?  
M: Not yet. It's not easy to find new ideas.  
W: Why don't you do some research online?  
M: I already did, but it didn't help.  
W: Umm.... I have a suggestion.  
M: What is it?  
W: Why don't you clean the house yourself? That will allow you to see what's troubling. Inconvenience could lead to an invention.  
M: That sounds like a good idea. I'll start right away.

8. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 English Composition을 수강할 수 없는 이유를 고르시오.

W: Hello, what can I do for you?  
M: Hi, I want to change my course to another one.  
W: What course did you register for?  
M: English Grammar. But I want to change it to English Composition. Is it too late to change?  
W: No, it's possible until this Friday. Can I have your ID card?  
M: Here you are.  
W: *[Pause]* Oh, I'm sorry. You're not allowed to take this course.  
M: What's the matter? Is it full?  
W: No, it's not. But English Composition is only available for third-year students.  
M: Oh, I thought first-year students could take it.  
W: I'm afraid you can't. You have to find another course.

W: It looks nice. How much is it?  
M: Every toy in this section is 40 dollars.  
W: I heard you are having a sale.  
M: Yes, if you buy two items from this section, you'll get a 50 percent discount on the second one.  
W: You mean I can get the second one at half price?  
M: Exactly.  
W: Great, I'll take two of this castle set.  
M: Would you like them gift-wrapped? It's one dollar extra for each item.  
W: No, thanks. Here's my credit card.  
M: Thank you.

W: I see. Do I need to buy her new book to get her signature?  
M: No, you don't need to. You can bring any of her books.  
W: Okay. Thank you very much.  
M: My pleasure.
