ANN : 여러분 안녕하십니까? 지금부터 전국 15개 시·도 교육청이 공동으로 주관하는 2010학년도 제2회 고등학교 3학년 영어듣기능력평가를 시작하겠습니다. 교실에 계시는 선생님들께서는 라디오의 음량을 알맞게 조절해 주시고, 학생 여러분은 답안지에 반, 번호, 그리고 이름을 써넣으시기 바랍니다. 모든 문제는 한 번씩만 들려 드리니, 잘 듣고 지시에 따라 물음에 답하시기 바랍니다.

ANN: 그럼 이제 시작 하겠습니다.

1번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 찾고 있는 재킷을 고르세요.

[The telephone rings]

W: This is the lost and found office. How can I help you?

M: I left my jacket on the subway.

W: When did you lose it?

M: This morning. I was so tired that I dozed off on the subway and got off without my jacket.

W: I see. What does your jacket look like?

M: It's just a normal leather jacket. The color is solid blue.

W: Leather, blue. What pattern is it?

M: I said it's solid. It has a breast pocket in the upper-left side.

W: Oh! I found it. Uh-oh, There are two, one jacket with an elastic waistband and the other without one.

M: That's it. Mine has an elastic waistband. Thank you.

That is my favorite jacket.

W: You're welcome. The office will close at 5. Please pick it up before then.

**2번입니다.** 대화를 듣고, 두 사람의 관계로 가장 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

W: It was a pleasantly crazy day, today.

M: I didn't expect so many people to come. I really worked short-handed.

W: Your team did a wonderful job handling all the orders. How lucky I am that you work for me.

M: I'm happy that we had a successful start as well.

W: The special offer in celebration of the opening was the main reason there was such a crowd on the first day. Also, today your dishes were really amazing.

M: I'm so flattered. I just hope my first customers were satisfied and left the restaurant happy.

W: I'm sure of that. The idea of placing some petals and herbs on the dishes was so brilliant. You should have seen how people enjoyed their meals.

M: I'm happy to imagine it.

W: I bet I'll be a millionaire sooner or later thanks to you.

M : Thanks. Then you will raise my pay, right?

W: Sure thing!

**3번입니다.** 대화를 듣고, 남자의 심경 변화로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

W: Mike, I invited, Mr. Allan and his wife to my tea party today.

M: Wow! Mrs. Allan is beautiful and she has a sweet smile! I'd like to make a cake for her, can I?

W: All right, you can make a cake for her. I'll prepare some tea and other things.

M: Jane, I have finally baked a small plate of cakes. Try this one, please.

W: Oh no, Mike! What did you put in this cake?

M: Is anything wrong? Don't you like it?

W: No, it's horrible! Did you use the medicine bottle that I left in the refrigerator?

M: Oh, no. I didn't know it was medicine. I thought it was milk.

**4번입니다.** 대화를 듣고, 여자가 지불해야 할 금액을 고르세요.

M: Good afternoon. What can I do for you?

W: I'd like to drop off my laundry. How much is it to clean a pair of pants?

M: It's three dollars. How many pairs do you have?

W: I brought 10 pairs of pants.

M: Are you a student?

W: Yes. Why are you asking that?

M: We have a student discount. You can get a 50 percent discount if you show your student ID.

W: Wow, here's my student ID. One more thing, I need to get this shirt ironed.

M: OK. Ironing is 4 dollars and there's no student discount. So is that all? 10 pairs of pants for cleaning and one shirt for ironing?

W: Yes. When will they be ready?

M: You can pick them up on Thursday.

**5번입니다.** 대화를 듣고, 남자가 전화를 건 목적을 고르세요.

[The telephone rings]

W: Hello. Nancy speaking.

M: Hello, this is the Cultural Center of Cincinnati.

W: Oh, yes. How can I help you?

M: We're calling to talk about the yoga class you registered for online.

W: Is there anything wrong with my sign-up information?

M: Not at all. The deadline for registration was yesterday, but we have only two applicants including you. So we reluctantly decided to cancel the course.

W: But there's no mention about that on your website.

M: We can't apologize enough. We ask for your understanding. Instead, we'll give you special discounts for any other classes if you want.

W: I'm afraid I'm not interested in the other classes.

M: Again, we are really sorry. If we open a yoga class next session, we'll let you know immediately.

W: Okay. Thanks, anyway.

**6번입니다.** 다음을 듣고, Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary에 대한 설명으로 잘못된 것을 고르세요.

W: Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary is located in the suburb of Brisbane, Australia. As the world's oldest and largest Koala Sanctuary, it is one of the very few places in the world where visitors are actually allowed to hold koalas. However, there is a rule that each koala can not be held for more than thirty minutes every day. The admission fee is \$57 for adults and \$34 for children. If you present your receipt, you can enjoy all of the events such as kangaroo feeding, koala cuddling, and sheep dog shows. Also, if you are planning to visit Lone Pine with a group of 15 people or more, you can receive group discount rates when you book in advance. Finally, it is open from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. 365 days a year, so that you can enjoy the wild animals any time.

**7번입니다.** 대화를 듣고, 남자가 가장 먼저 할 일을 고르세요.

W: Hmm. Let me see. I'm heading to the library for an appointment with my friend. Is there a vet clinic near the library?

M: Yes, there is. Will you give me a ride?

W: Yes. I will take you with me, and then you may walk for the other things.

M : I can't thank you enough. Let's go.

**8번입니다.** 대화를 듣고, 내용과 가장 잘 어울리는 속담을 고르세요.

W: Is your group ready for the school dance competition?  
M: Don't even talk about it. My head aches when I think of it.  
W: Why? Your group has so many talented members.  
M: Yes. They are all good at dancing and have excellent artistic talents. Dan is majoring in ballet, Whitney is a modern dancer, and Emily is good at music composition.  
W: That's why we thought your group would be the winner.  
M: So did I. However, we haven't seen things eye to eye from the beginning. We spent a week choosing background music.  
W: But you have Emily. She has a wide knowledge of music.  
M: Yes, right. She suggested her song for our performance, but Dan insisted on classical music while Whitney preferred pop-music.  
W: So did you reach an agreement?  
M: Not yet. They're still arguing.  
W: Well, it's not always good to have too many capable people around.  
M: You can say that again.

**9번입니다.** 다음 그림의 상황에 가장 적절한 대화를 고르세요.

- ① W: Can you show me where the stadium is?  
M: Sure, go straight this way and turn left at the first corner.
- ② W: Please give a speech to cheer your team players on.  
M: Way to go! Victory will be ours!
- ③ W: Are you ready to break the previous record in this race?  
M: Yes. I'm all geared to set a new record.
- ④ W: What a beautiful flower arrangement! Did you make it?  
M: Yes, I've been taking lessons in flower arrangement.
- ⑤ W: Wow, you set a new world record! How do you feel now?  
M: I'm on cloud nine! It couldn't be better.

**10번입니다.** 다음을 듣고, 여자가 한 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

W: Hello, everyone! I really appreciate you all visiting us for blood donation. Though donating blood is safe and simple, you should check several things for safety. First of all, you're required to be healthy, weigh at least 50kg, and be age 17 or older. If you've drunk alcohol or taken aspirin within 12 hours, your donation isn't allowed. Also it's not recommended for those who recently traveled to areas where malaria is common. However, it doesn't matter if you have a history of cancer. If you think you're qualified, please move to the blood testing room on your left side. Thank you.

#### 11번입니다. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 남자에게 부탁한 일을 고르세요.

Visitors to the festival can enjoy masterpieces by world-renowned sand sculptors, Beach Ball Games, live music and even participate in a sand sculpture competition themselves. You can refer to the guidebook provided at the beach for more information.

M: How long does the sand festival last?

W: The festival is held from this Friday, June 4th to Monday, June 7th. During the festival period, over 90 businesses near Sun Beach, including lodgings, restaurants, and hot-spring facilities, will offer 15% discounts to visitors.

**13번입니다.** 다음을 듣고, 내용과 일치하지 않는 것을 고르세요.

Captain : Hello everyone, this is the captain speaking. Welcome aboard Sky Airline flight 704 bound for London. Our flight time today is 14 and a half hours after takeoff and we will be cruising at an average altitude of 33,000 feet.
