ANN : 이제 시작하겠습니다.

1번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자가 사려고 하는 모자를 고르세요.

M: How about throwing a surprise party for Martha?

W: Sure. We can buy a hat for her birthday party.

We should get a unique and funny hat.

M: That's a very good idea.

I think a magician's hat with flowers on top of it would be wonderful.

W: It looks fantastic, but I think it's uncomfortable to wear.

How about a cone hat?

M: OK. How about this one with a star?

W: No. I think she would like the hat with the wide brim and the big ribbon.

M: Yeah, good choice.

2번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 두 사람의 관계로 가장 알맞은 것을 고르세요.

W: Hi. We want to ride around in the park.

How much is a bike rental?

M: A single-seater is 10 dollars per hour and a two-seater is 15 dollars.

If you keep it for longer than an hour, you'll have to pay an extra dollar per every 5 minutes.
