(A) Hemingway often thought of courage as a person's ability (a) to be calm and controlled in the face of death. His theme is presented in his novel "For Whom the Bell Tolls?", the story "The Old Man and the Sea" and "A Day's Wait". By misunderstanding a different thermometer, the boy thought he was running a high fever and would soon die. However, he took his death bravely and (b) waited quietly for it. The boy showed us he had courage.

(B) To me, courage means truth and justice. The person in a high position often hears songs in praise of himself or herself. Some people are sincere. Some are (c) flattering the superior in their own favor. The leader also needs both courage to welcome criticism and those who have the courage to criticise him. Such courage may come from mutual understanding. I think a man of courage will value truth and justice, and (d) not hesitate to do what he thinks is right. There is no such word as fear in his dictionary.

(C) I think such a definition of courage is far from being enough. Courage should not be limited and related only to death.
