ANN : 이제 시작하겠습니다.

1번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자가 구입할 카드를 고르세요.

W: I'm going to buy a thank you card for my teacher online. Can you help me?

M: Sure, let me check my favorite website. It has a wide range of selections. [*Clicking*] How about this one with two hearts overlapping?

W: It's too simple. Is there one with flowers?

M: Well... [*Clicking*] Oh, this one's cute.

W: You mean the card printed with one big flower? It looks good, but I need a more elegant one.

M: Then, this would be better. It's decorated with lots of flowers.

W: It looks like a heart. But aren't the letters too small?

M: Right. [*Pause*] Oh, these are in larger font sizes. Which one do you like better, the card with two flowers or the card with a bunch of flowers?

W: The more flowers, the better. I'll take that one.

2번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 남자의 심경으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

M: Ms. Brown, may I talk to you for a moment?

W: Of course, Ethan. Come on in. [*Pause*] Why the long face? Is something wrong?

M: I'm having trouble sleeping these days. I keep tossing and turning all night.

W: What's the problem?

M: Well, I'm going to represent the school in the debate.

W: Oh, I heard that you made it to the finals! Congratulations, you must be proud of yourself.

M: Thank you. But that's the problem.

W: What do you mean?

3번입니다.

다음을 듣고, 남자가 설명하는 것으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르세요.

M: Let me introduce you to the most popular woman in our museum.

[*Pause*] This incredible woman offers a fascinating look into life as it was long ago. At the time of her burial, she was wearing silk and cotton, which meant she was a high-ranking member of society. Notice the remarkably good condition of her skin, hair, and face. Even her eyelashes have been well preserved. The low humidity and lack of air when her body was laid to rest make it look like she only died recently. However, she's over 700 years old!

4번입니다.

대화를 듣고, 여자가 지불한 총 금액을 고르세요.

W: Thank you so much. You did a great job. I like it very much.

M: I'm glad you like it.

W: Here's a hundred dollars.

M: Julie Emerson? Oh, I see. She's taking my class. So what's the problem?

W: She had a car accident on her way home yesterday.

M: Really? Is she all right?

W: Yes, she is okay. But she's afraid she won't be able to attend your class this afternoon.

M: Okay. It won't be counted as an absence.

W: Would it be okay if I gave you her assignment?

M: Well, you can bring it to my office anytime today.

W: Would it be possible to come by tomorrow?

8번입니다.

W: Can I have your name please?

M: Jim Smith.

W: Thank you, Jim. I see we have your medical records here and you've visited our clinic before. Do you have a cold again?

M: No, I think I have itchy skin, and it's really annoying.

W: Can you come in at about 11 tomorrow morning?

M: I'm afraid not. Actually, I'm on vacation right now.

W: Then, when are you available?

M: I'll be back in 2 days.

W: Well, today is Tuesday. So how about 3 p.m. on Thursday?

M: That's fine. See you then.

14번입니다.

다음 설명을 듣고, 해당하는 가장 적절한 그림을 고르세요.

M: This posture helps strengthen our muscles and improve our flexibility. Starting from an upright position, fold your right leg backwards. At the same time, hold your right foot with your right hand and bend your upper body forward. Stretch your left arm straight in front of you. Try to stretch it as much as possible. Trying to keep your balance, hold this posture for ten seconds.

W: Welcome to the TV program 'Plant World.' Today I'd like to introduce a plant called 'Monk's Hood.' This plant can slowly move over time. How is this possible?
