Sonar is used on ships and submarines to detect and locate other ships or large schools of fish, to determine the depth of the water and to avoid obstacles such as reefs. Sonar can be used to determine the distance to an object which is reflecting sound waves. It can also determine the direction and whether the object is moving or still.

Preparation can be as simple as opening the shell, while cooking can be as spare as adding butter or salt, or can be very elaborate. Oysters are low in calories, one dozen raw oysters contain approximately 110 calories, rich in iron and high in calcium and vitamin A. Like all shellfish, oysters have an extremely short shelf-life, and should be fresh when consumed. Purists insist on eating oysters raw, with no dressing except perhaps lemon juice or vinegar. Raw oysters are regarded like wines in that they have complex flavors that vary greatly among varieties and regions: some taste sweet, others salty or with a mineral flavor, or even like melons.



The Polynesians did not need a compass because (a) the stars told them with unerring accuracy the direction in which they were traveling at night. These sailors knew the positions of 150 rising and setting stars. To reach his destination the navigator would steer towards the star on the horizon that rose over the island to which he wished to go. Just as the stars were the compass of the Polynesian, the patterns formed by (b) the ocean waves were his navigational charts. The navigator knew that the ocean waves traveled in predictable ways. Their size, frequency, and direction all provided valuable information. For example, the waves running towards an island bounced back, creating a swell pattern different from waves in the open ocean. These patterns were like an open map to the Polynesian sailors. Even on dark, cloudy nights, the navigator could tell from the angle at which the waves hit his canoe the direction in which he was traveling. The day sky, filled with birds and clouds, also gave unmistakable signs to the Polynesians. (c) Some seabirds were known to leave their island nests during the day to hunt for fish in the open sea and then to return at night. The sailors who encountered these birds in the evening could follow them home, or, finding them in the mornings, know to travel in an opposite direction. Because land was warmer than the ocean, (d) the clouds that formed over islands were different from those over the open sea. Those over land tended to be large and stationary, while those over the ocean were usually smaller and moved with the wind. The sight of a large, stationary cloud, therefore, was another sure signpost for the navigator. Also, a cloud that was light green on the bottom indicated to the Polynesians that it was located over (e) shallow water.
