As early as 1,000 B.C., shoes were created to allow people to walk through dense jungles, burning sands and other hazards without injury. Made primarily of various types of barks, leaves, and animal skins, the first shoes took forms of sandals and moccasins. Sandals were found mainly in warmer regions, and moccasins in colder areas. In medieval times, the toes on men's shoes grew longer and more pointed. The longer the toe, the higher the status was. By the late 1500s, shoemakers began to attach high heels to the shoes. And women's ankle shoes had side laces. Modern technology allowed for new innovations in footwear. It brought forth automated shoemaking machinery. This allowed leather to be used as longer-lasting soles. The invention of the sewing machine in 1846 opened more doors to shoemakers. They became industrialized shoe manufacturers. In modern era, there are athletic shoes engineered with technology and even children's shoes that light up and make noise. What does the future of shoes hold? Only innovation and imagination can tell!
